Antonio Andrés is a Professor of Personality and Criminal Psychology at the University of Barcelona. He is the Director of the *Group of Advanced Studies in Violence* (<http://www.ub.edu/geav>) and of the *Master in Law and Forensic Psychology* programme at that university. He has participated, as director or researcher, in many research projects financed by private and public institutions from the Catalan and the Spanish Governments.

Santiago Redondo is a Professor of Criminology at the University of Barcelona, where he is the principal researcher of the *Group of Advanced Studies in Violence* (<http://www.ub.edu/geav>). He has formerly been a prison psychologist, prison governor and director of the prison rehabilitation services at the Justice Department of Catalonia (Spain). His current research is in the fields of treatment programmes with offenders, risk assessment, developmental criminology, and criminological theory.
