Sir David Calvert-Smith, who was the Director of Public Prosecutions from 1998 to 2003 and then a High Court Judge, was appointed Chairman of the Parole Board in 2012. The Parole Board was set up as an advisory body in 1968 and has slowly evolved into a more independent and court-like body deciding on the release of life sentence, dangerous and recalled offenders.

This is an exciting and important point in the Parole Board's history and Sir David will be discussing the challenges which lie ahead.

The talk, in which Sir David will explore the wider context in which the Parole Board has to fulfil its role, is highly recommended for all those interested in criminal justice and penal issues.
