

Young Children CAN be Competent Witnesses When Competently Interviewed

In this seminar, Professor Lamb will explain why young children are often deemed incompetent witnesses, before reviewing research conducted in collaboration with police officers and forensic investigators in several countries, showing that children can provide substantial amounts of information in forensic contexts.

Michael Lamb is currently Professor of Psychology in the Social Sciences, and Head of the Department of Social and Developmental Psychology in the new Faculty of Politics, Psychology, Sociology, and International studies, at the University of Cambridge. He previously, headed a research unit at the National Institute of Child Health and Human Development near Washington, DC.
