Nicky Padfield will draw on her recent research studying Parole Board hearings to ask a number of questions about the role of the Parole Board today. The research, carried out in 2016 and 2017, involved observing both three-way video-hearings, held at the Parole Board's headquarters, and oral hearings held in 11 different prisons, as well as interviews with many participants in the process. She argues that a 'culture' of delay allows unnecessary deferrals and adjournments. She will suggest that the independence of the Board should be strengthened; that the process needs many procedural improvements; and that prisoners should have much more support and advice throughout the release process. These recommendations lead to a broader question, whether there should be judicial supervision of the implementation of all sentences.
